The Elenydd hostels have been valued for many years as friendly, simple hostels in stunning locations. When, in 2006, the YHA announced that it was to sell all three of these hostels, voluntary wardens, hostellers, and local people worked together and established the Elenydd Wilderness Hostels Trust. Since January 2007 we have been leasing and running Ty'n Cornel from the hostel's new owners and after a successful fundraising campaign bought Dolgoch hostel from the YHA in November 2007.

We want to build on the success of our first year and enable more people to experience the magic of the Elenydd and the rich history and culture of this area of Wales. 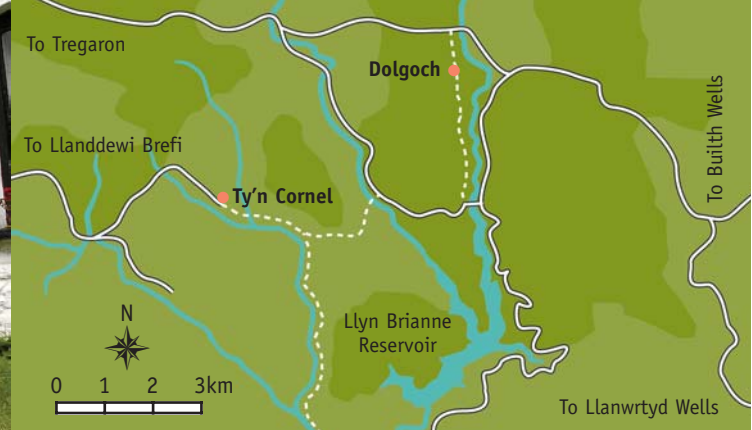

Llanddewi Brefi  
Ceredigion, SY25 6PH  
OS Grid Ref: SN 751 535  
Mobile signal 1 mile away (no phone).  
16 beds in 2 rooms of 8 bunk-beds

Situated near the head of the beautiful Doethie valley, off the minor road going east from Llanddewi Brefi. Nearest trains at Llanwrtyd Wells (16 miles), buses at Llanddewi Brefi (7 miles)

Tregaron, Ceredigion, SY25 6NR

Lit by gas lights (no electricity).  
21 beds in 3 rooms of 4, 5, 12 bunk-beds

Set by the peaceful River Towy, down a track off the Tregaron to Abergwesyn road. Nearest trains at Llanwrtyd Wells (11 miles), buses at Tregaron (10 miles)

## Things to do

Visit this area to enjoy a wealth of outdoor activities, with walks, cycling and horse riding routes starting from outside the hostel doors. Ty'n Cornel hostel is on the Cambrian Way long distance footpath and the central off-road section of the Lon Las Cymru cycle route passes Dolgoch hostel

Less strenuous is bird watching, and if you fancy star-gazing, there is no night-time light pollution in the Elenydd. In the evenings relax by the fire and share your day with fellow hostellers, or just soak in the atmosphere.

In addition to the outdoor activities of the area, other nearby attractions include the coast of Cardigan Bay, local towns and villages such as Aberystwyth and Tregaron, the remains of Strata Florida abbey, Llanerchaeron - a National Trust property, a wealth of mining history, nature reserves, and the water reservoirs of Llyn Brianne, Teifi Pools and the Elan Valley.
